

# Land Suit Filed Against Travis County

A suit against Travis County, filed in 53rd District Court by James M. Vande Hey and Mrs. Grace M. Bright, has asked cancellation of the dedication of a small county park on Lake Travis.

The plaintiffs claim that the county has not lived up to a dedication agreement involving "Tom Hughes Park," a 3.5 - acre tract on the north side of the lake.

According to the petition, the right-of-way easement of the tract was given the county by Mr. and Mrs. Thomas B. Hughes on Jan. 18, 1939, for the clearing and "rendering fit" of the land as a park.

Hey and Mrs. Bright, who succeeded to the rights of Hughes and his wife, claim the county has fail

ed to live up to the agreement and are seeking judgment giving them title and possession of the property with the exception of a roadway built by the county.

## Navy Families Return to 'Gitmo'

NOFOLK, Va. (AP)—Thirty-one Navy dependents leave here by air today to return to Guantanamo Naval Base in Cuba.

They are the first of the dependents evacuated at the onset of the Cuban crisis to return.

The first dependents to return by sea will leave New York aboard the USNS Geiger Dec. 14. The Geiger is due to sail from New York again Dec. 19 with a second load of dependents.
